FROM THE PASTOR

Dear friends,

The 3rd year of our Thriving Congregations work kicks off in March. Thriving Congregations is a 4 year program led by Lexington Theological Seminary and funded by a grant by the Lilly Foundation. The purpose of the program is to study what makes a congregation thrive. We were chosen to participate in this program because we show evidence of Thriving.

The work of the program is to continue to thrive and learn new tools to fulfill our calling. The work for 2022 is to consider the role of empowered laity. This is the year to better define the roles of Elders, Deacons, Trustees and the Leadership Council.

In March there will be 3 workshops offered online that are for our lay leaders. These are scheduled for 3/10, 3/17, and 3/24 at 7:30 pm. Lay leaders, all lay leaders, are encouraged to attend. The topics are faith formation led by the LTS professor for Biblical studies; planning imaginative worship with the LTS professor for preaching and worship; and clergy wellness with one of my Doctoral candidate colleagues who had just joined the staff of Disciples Home Missions.

Austin Hartke, the author of “Transforming:

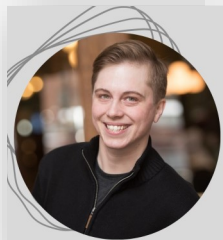
