The next book selection is "The Hotel Nantucket" by Elin Hilderbrand. A description of the book from the website [goodreads](#) says:

"After a tragic fire in 1922 that killed 19-year-old chambermaid, Grace Hadley, The Hotel Nantucket descended from a gilded age gem to a mediocre budget-friendly lodge to inevitably an abandoned eyesore — until it's purchased and renovated top to bottom by London billionaire, Xavier Darling. Xavier hires Nantucket sweetheart Lizbet Keaton as his general manager, and Lizbet, in turn, pulls together a charismatic, if inexperienced, staff who share the vision of turning the fate of the hotel around. They face challenges in getting along with one another (and with the guests), in overcoming the hotel's bad reputation, and in surviving the (mostly) harmless shenanigans of Grace Hadley herself — who won't stop haunting the hotel until her murder is acknowledged."



[Registration](#) includes lodging, meals, and all retreat activities. Costs are already subsidized and we encourage everyone who is able to select the regular registration rate. Sharing a bunk room is the most affordable way to participate in the retreat (and live in community!).

Room reservation and one registration: \$475

This option secures registration for one person and a room with one king bed, two queen beds, or four bunk beds.

Room reservation and one registration for students/restricted income: \$350

This option is for students or individuals with restricted income and secures registration for one person and a room with one king bed, two queen beds, or four

bunk beds. When reserving your tickets, use this discount code: hoping-in-color.

Additional registration: \$225

This option secures an additional registration for someone in a shared room.
