Summary of the September '22 Leadership Council Meeting

OLD BUSINESS

⇒ **Open and Affirming (O&A)**

- Pastor Tracy will no longer be attending or leading any O&A meetings in order to be an objective third-party to the process and be able to effectively pastor for all members, regardless of their position within the O&A process.
- Florence Christian Church mentioned that they saw benefit to becoming O&A because of the number of young families it attracted to their congregation.

⇒ **BLINK**

- We are unable to participate in the parade or host an exhibit, but we are considering opening a hospitality suite during the exhibits for folks who may need a rest and a drink of water from walking through the city streets.

⇒ **Financial Secretary & Treasurer**

- We are still in need of two volunteers to be the Financial Secretary and the Treasurer for the church.

⇒ **Holy Cow! Meeting Data**

- We are looking into how we can take the results from the survey and implement that information into our ministries. It may end up that our ministries and operations change how they look in order to fit our congregation, instead of trying to fit our congregation into a mold that no longer serves us.

⇒ **Porta John 3:16 Ministry**

- We need to increase the number of days per week that the porta-john is cleaned. We need \$200 to fund the additional cleanings until the Regional Meeting.
- We will have a table representing this ministry at the Regional Meeting and we will hope to encourage donations/funding for the ministry at that time. We will need a volunteer to run the table with Lisa Kay.

NEW BUSINESS

⇒ **Breakfast Missions of Covington**

- Tom is changing the days of the week that the mission is serving breakfast to Sunday, Tuesday, and Thursday. The Leadership Council approved use of the Fellowship Hall during those days/times.

⇒ **Leadership Council / Congregational Meeting**

- Someone needs to replace Alex's position on the council now that she is an employee of the church.
- The original intention of the Leadership Council was to be a group composed of "point persons" for various committees that have existed and meet monthly to "report back". We do not currently have "point persons" for various tasks (example: building maintenance) and we cannot go back to having committees because we no longer have enough volunteers to fill them.

⇒ **Regional Meeting**

- We need to find volunteers to attend and vote on behalf of our congregation.

Invite A Friend

Excerpt From: *How To Invite Friends To Church So They Will Actually Come*

- 1. Spend some time with God.**
- 2. Tell your friend a story; your story.**
- 3. Invite your friends to tell you what they believe.**
- 4. Invite strategically.**
- 5. Repeat.**

Do you remember who first invited you to church? It is either that you grew up in the church and came with your family or a friend invited you to church. Perhaps, you even grew up in a church, moved and had to find a new church. How did you land here?

Every church will say their primary goal is to grow numerically. While we should also be concerned about spiritual growth, I know that more space in our pews is a cause for some anxiety. Aside, from wanting to grow numerically, why do we want to grow?

Every church will add to their list of goals is to attract new young families. While we should also be concerned with the faith of those across the life span, I know that we enjoy having children in our churches. We even enjoy their wiggles and giggles. Why do we enjoy having children in our pews?

The answer is simple. Having lots of children and full pews gives us hope that the Church and the Gospel of Jesus Christ will live on through another generation and that we will have enough servant hands to do the ministries we hope to offer Covington.



But, growing our church means that we must extend the invitation to others. That means we might have to engage in that icky E word – evangelism. Evangelism doesn't have to be scary.
