Again, thank you dear friends.





Petition to Make Porta John 3:16 Permanent

During the COVID pandemic, when many establishments in the community were closed to the public, people experiencing homelessness had fewer options to use a restroom. There was no access to the library, restaurants, and other places where people experiencing homelessness could use the restroom. According to bloomberg.com, "...Covid-19 exposed and exacerbated the American bathroom gap... In cities with high rates of homelessness, efforts to install temporary hygiene facilities during lockdowns often met resistance from community members and city officials, even as frustrated local businesses locked their restrooms to prevent use from unhoused individuals."

According to an article in "The Gate" by Brian Cohen, the state of Kentucky is tied for the 2nd to the last state for access to public restrooms with only 2 public restrooms per 100,000 people.

The Relief ministry with Porta John 3:16 has provided a place where people can relieve themselves with dignity and privacy during a time when it has been difficult to find a public restroom. Porta John 3:16 ministry meets the needs of those experiencing homelessness as well as City of Covington visitors who come downtown for many of the community activities. Rev. Tracy Siegman says, "Covid revealed a justice issue and we responded."

People with fewer options were relieving themselves in public places that posed public health concerns: behind bushes, bus stops, etc. "The state of public restrooms in the U.S. is pretty deplorable, with certain exceptions," says Steven Soifer, president and co-founder of the American Restroom Association.

First Christian Church, Covington, seeing the issue, responded to the need of their neighbors. FCC Covington applied to the City of Covington for a permit to place a portable restroom on our property. We were approved for a permit by the city and Rumpke delivered a portable restroom in early 2021.

Recently, First Christian Church was advised by the City of Covington that we were not allowed to have this ministry as a permanent structure on our property and that it would need to be taken down. We hope that you can take a moment to [sign this petition](#) and that a show of support from the community will help us to be able to continue this impactful ministry.
